

SAKSHAR BHARAT: Primary Enrollment to Drive 100% Literacy

India has achieved a remarkable milestone of a 100% Gross Enrolment Ratio2 in elementary school education and above 90% in upper primary (ages 11-13). Taking this as a trigger, India must now aim to achieve 100% literacy—ensuring all members in a family are literate. Schools and students will be pivotal for the success of such a program. First time schooler will be expected to list the illiterates in his/ her home, which will be kick start the program of training and certifying them as literates.

The literacy rate for the year 2022-23 is 80.3%3 and, with a population of 1430 Million4, the number of illiterates is estimated at max 282 million. Urban areas have a rate of 89%, while rural areas are at 77%. The male literacy rate is 86.2%, and the female literacy rate is 74.2%. The global illiterate population is 773 million5, making India home to the largest number of illiterates in the world.

Under the Saakshar Bharat program (MOE 2009), 76.4 million adult learners were certified as literate until 2023, averaging 5.5 million per year over 14 years6. We now need to change gears and make 56 million literates every year with the help of students, schools, corporations, institutions, NGOs, and volunteers, hence its appropriate to call it Saakshar Bharat Mission. This can be achieved similar to Swachh Bharat Mission, though promoting literacy demands a significantly greater behavioural and attitudinal shift than encouraging cleanliness.





Empowering India's Marginalized Youth: Rupantar's Revolutionary Influence on Education

Parivartan Mahila Sanstha, established in 2000, began its journey with a mission to empower women and ensure their dignity and freedom. Initially focused on women's empowerment, Parivartan has evolved into a holistic community development organization, recognizing that sustainable development requires the involvement of the entire community. Today, Parivartan works extensively in education, fostering the growth of children and communities through knowledge sharing and holistic development.

The Genesis of Parivartan

The inception of Parivartan was driven by a group of dedicated women from Maharashtra who were deeply involved in various social sectors. Their shared vision was to uplift women by making them self-reliant and dignified members of society. However, as the organization grew, it became evident that empowering women also meant engaging their communities to create a supportive environment for sustained progress.



One of the pivotal initiatives by Parivartan is the Mukta Balikashram, a residential care center established in 2005 for orphaned and destitute girls. Recognizing that education is crucial for these girls, Mukta Balikashram offers comprehensive care from the age of four until they complete their education at seventeen. The center provides not only shelter but also addresses the emotional, social, and educational needs of the girls.

At Mukta, education is given paramount importance. Young girls attend local schools and receive additional tuition to ensure they excel academically. Beyond conventional education, the girls are taught vocational skills such as bag making, sewing, embroidery, jewelry making, and beauty parlor training, equipping them with skills to secure their futures. Mental and emotional well-being is also a priority, with regular counseling sessions provided by professionals from the Institute for Psychological Help (IPH) in Thane.

Holistic Education: Beyond Academics

Parivartan's approach to education extends beyond the classroom. At Mukta, the girls are engaged in personality development programs and emotional development activities. Regular medical camps ensure their physical well-being, while nutritionists provide guidance on healthy eating. This holistic approach ensures that the girls are not only academically proficient but also physically healthy and emotionally resilient.

Expanding Horizons: Community Development Programs

Parivartan's commitment to education and community development is exemplified in its work in the tribal belt of Thane District. In areas like Mokhada, where educational opportunities are scarce, Parivartan has implemented the Khelwadi project. This initiative focuses on providing quality education to children from first to fourth standards, improving their reading, writing, and communication skills through innovative teaching methods.

The Khelwadi project also addresses broader social issues. Parivartan conducts awareness camps on the National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (NREGA), empowering villagers to utilize government schemes for

Affordability and Its Impact



- <u>4. SAKSHAM:</u> This scheme focuses on the education of children with special needs, providing resources and support for inclusive education.
- <u>5. SWAYAM:</u> An e-learning platform that offers free online courses and educational resources to students across the country, making education more accessible and flexible.
