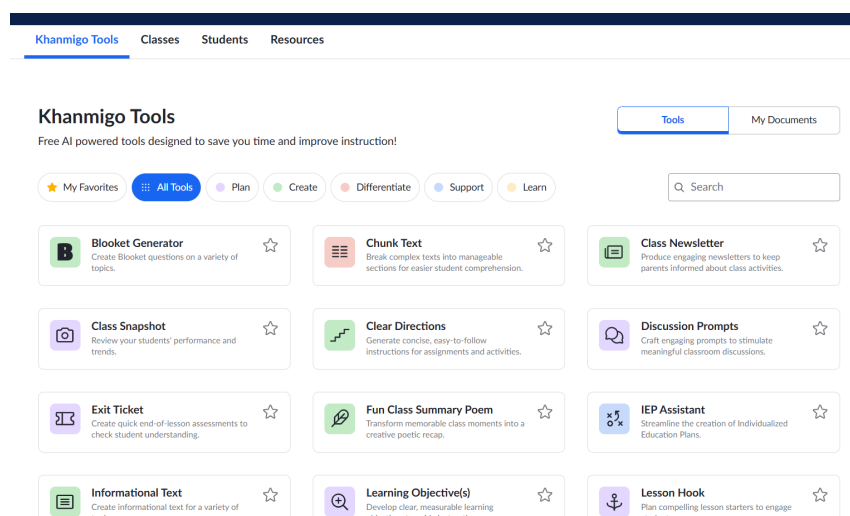

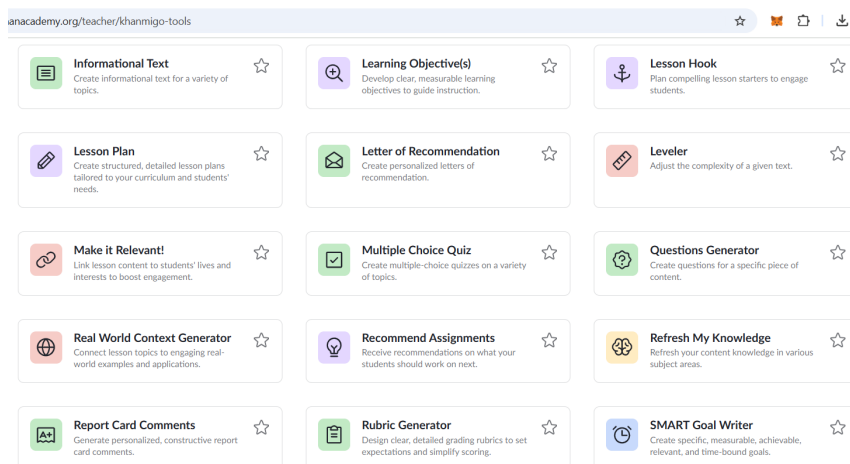

KHANMIGO – THE AI TOOL FOR TEACHERS ON KHAN ACADEMY'S LMS

In this edition we are happy to cover some of the features of KHANMIGO, the Artificial Intelligence (AI) assistant for teachers that is made available on the learning management system (LMS) of Khan Academy.



First, the BlooKet Generator is a wonderful assistant for teachers to prepare questions on the fly given a topic for a particular standard. When we typed the topic as 'Photosynthesis' for 8th standard and asked for questions that are suitable for students from Bihar Board. We got 6 questions for the prompt we gave, which is student should understand the definition, its process, and the importance.

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For example, 'What are the raw materials needed for photosynthesis?', 'What gas do plants release during photosynthesis?', etc. However, the coverage on the sub-topics prompted was poor. Example it did not give questions around definition, which part of plant performs photosynthesis, etc. However, for a teacher question bank on the go is a wonderful help.

Expanding AI's Role in Classrooms

Similarly, there are other tools that all teachers should explore, such as:

Chunk Test – Breaks complex texts into manageable sections for easier student comprehension. This is especially useful for students who struggle with reading comprehension or learning in a second language.

Class Newsletter – Produces engaging newsletters to keep parents informed about class activities, upcoming tests, and important announcements. This strengthens the school-home connection.

Clear Directions – Generates concise, easy-to-follow instructions for assignments and activities, reducing student confusion and improving productivity.

Exit Ticket – Creates quick end-of-lesson assessments to check student understanding. This allows teachers to make real-time adjustments in their lesson plans.

Lesson Hook – Plans compelling lesson starters to engage students, making learning interactive and thought-provoking.

Text Rewriter – Customizes text to meet instructional needs, ensuring content is appropriate for different learning levels.

Beyond these features, Khanmigo is also shaping the future of AI-assisted adaptive learning. It can tailor lessons based on student performance, providing personalized hints and explanations. For instance, if a student struggles with fractions, Khanmigo can break the concept down further or offer additional practice problems.

While Khanmigo offers incredible potential, challenges remain. AI cannot replace teachers but should be seen as a co-teacher—an assistant that enhances but does not substitute human interaction. Why Rural Parents Prefer Private Schools

Despite the Right to Education Act, many opt for private schools due to:

- Perceived Better Education: Stricter teacher attendance and English-medium instruction.
- Accountability: Private schools rely on fees and must ensure discipline.
- Social Aspirations: Uniforms, English textbooks, and structured learning create a "modern" image.

However, private schools often lack trained teachers and proper facilities, imposing a financial burden on families.

The Rural Digital Divide

While urban EdTech is thriving, rural digital education faces hurdles:

- Poor Infrastructure: Unstable electricity and internet.
- Limited Device Access: Shared smartphones or no digital devices.
- Untrained Teachers: Many lack digital skills.
- Language Barriers: Most digital content is in English or Hindi.

A Balanced Approach for Rural Education

1. Strengthening Government Schools: Improve teacher accountability, infrastructure, and curricula.
2. Inclusive Digital Learning: Develop regional content, use offline mobile apps, and radio-based education.
3. Teacher Training: Equip educators with digital skills through peer mentorship programs.
4. Affordability: Government and NGOs should subsidize digital access for underprivileged students.
